NAPLAN

This week our year 3 and year 5 students will be completing the NAPLAN tests.

The **National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)** is a series of tests focused on basic skills that are administered annually to all students in years 3,5,7 & 9. These standardised tests assess students' reading, writing, language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The tests are also designed to be carried out on the same days all across Australia. The data obtained from the NAPLAN tests are collated and used to show all schools' average performance against other schools in the country. We analyse the data from the NAPLAN tests alongside other internal assessment measures to ensure we are supporting all students to achieve the best possible outcomes.

Students or parents should not stress about the tests – they are just another measure for us to use to continually reflect on and improve our educational programs.

Where the funds go

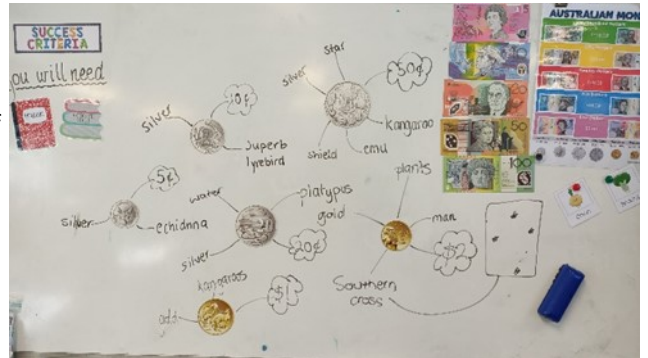
Funds raised through 2021 Pirate Day will be directed specifically to Dr Raelene Endersby's scientific investigation into immunotherapy for children with brain cancer.

JUNIOR CLASS

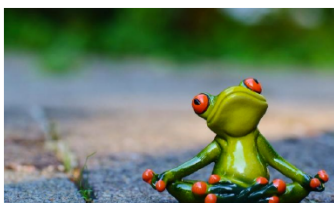
SENIOR CLASS
