CLASSROOM NEWS


Kimochis

By now you will be aware of all of the Kimochi's characters. The next part of the program is to introduce to you the 7 keys to Communication that the students are currently working on at school.



Use a talking face and body. SEL TOOLS: Talking Eyes, Fighting Eyes, Serious Eyes

Use a Talking Face and Body. We practiced strategies for maintaining a positive facial expression and body language when experiencing upset emotions and conflicts instead of a mean or hurtful facial expression (Fighting Face) and body language.





JUNIOR CLASS

The junior class had been having an absolute ball in their maths classes this week. We have been working on our addition strategies using lots of different materials to help us. We have mastered using unifix blocks to work out simple addition problems and we are working on more throughout the week.





STEM

In STEM we have been looking at all sorts of different things. The juniors made marble games and challenged their classmates in a competition to see who could come up with the most creative and challenging playdough maze.

SENIOR CLASS
