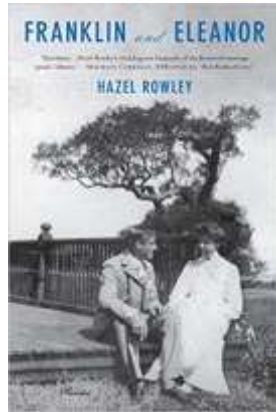

Expect all the songs you know and love, plus new twists and turns to bring the Blues Brothers into the 21st century.

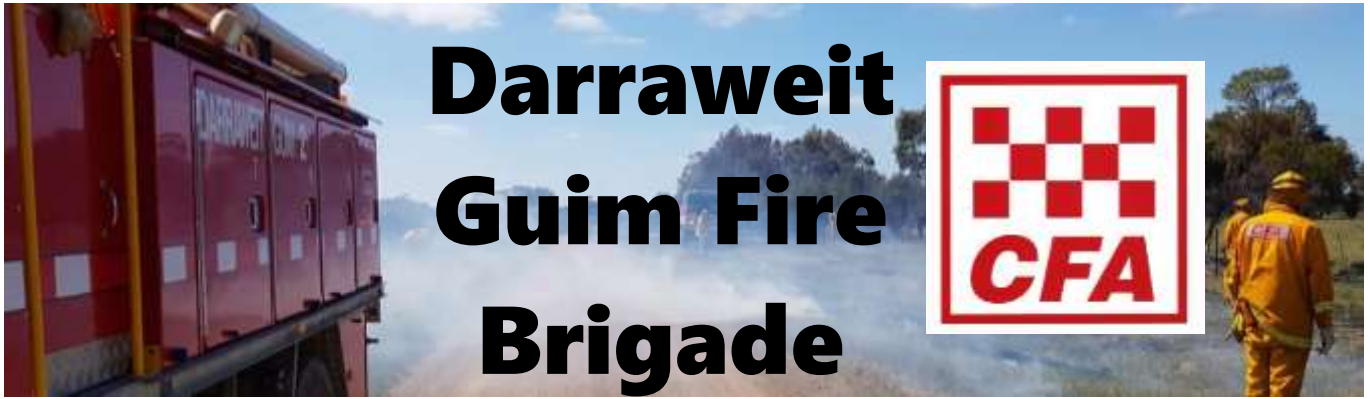

Check Your Heater to Avoid Fire Risk

Despite what we said last month Fire Restrictions have ended. As the cooler weather approaches, here are some precautions that you can take to prevent the potential for your heating to cause a fire.

- 🔧 To avoid carbon monoxide poisoning and reduce the risk of fire, make sure you have your gas heater serviced by a professional at least every 2 years.
- 🔧 Make sure your wood fired heating is free of build-up and obstructions and have your chimney cleaned annually.
- 🔧 ALWAYS make sure you turn heaters off before leaving home or going to bed and never leave portable heaters unattended.
- 🔧 Interconnected smoke alarms, located in all living and sleeping areas of the home, can save lives in the event of a fire.
